IN THE COMMUNITY

Neighbors App – Brown County Sheriff's Office has joined Neighbors by Ring. The Neighbors App is FREE! Download by texting **browncountywi** to **555888**. Being a part of this forum is another way for the community and law enforcement to come together to mitigate crime and alert real-time activity. It affords law enforcement and Village DEO Verheyen to work closely with the residents of Denmark and their concerns. Please spread the word about the Neighbors App in Denmark. The more residents on the App, the more support we have as a community! Information about this App was also sent out with the Village quarterly water bills in **June** and on the Village Facebook.

Denmark Middle School FFA – On **June 6th**, members of the middle school FFA, along with advisor Marty Nowak, presented DEO Verheyen with 25 packages they put together for children. These packages contained fleece blankets, stuffed animals, coloring books and crayons. They are kept in the Village squads for DEOs to provide children on particular calls for service. Thank you for your generosity, time spent and thoughtfulness FFA!

Denmark Branch Library – DEO Verheyen continues to monitor Library events and be present when permits. DEO Verheyen has scheduled 'Story-time with an Officer' at the Denmark branch: **August 8th at 10:30 – 11:30 a.m.**

Ruby's Pantry – DEO Verheyen continues to engage in Ruby's Pantry. DEO Verheyen worked with Denmark DPW to begin temporary No Parking on the north side of Prospect St during the **May-August** pantries. This is due to the construction zone detour and volume of traffic that now travels Prospect.

Dementia Live Workshop – DEO Verheyen is counting down the days for the Dementia Live presentation on **July 11th at 1:30 – 2:30 p.m.** This is **FREE**. It will take place at the Senior Activity Center. This workshop offers a unique inside-out understanding of dementia and aging.

Summer Leagues – DEOs have the appropriate league schedules for summer and will continue to engage and police at the parks and during these summer evenings with games.

Salm Partners – DEO Verheyen attended the groundbreaking event on **June 25th** for the new / additional location of Salm Partners at 625 Hager Rd.

World Tournament – DEO Verheyen attended a planning committee meeting **June 10th** for the 73rd annual International Softball Congress World Tournament coming to Denmark area this **August 10th – 17th**.

Efforts and plans are being discussed to help with traffic volume and parking, including possible “soft” road closures in the Town of New Denmark near Circle Tap. We are excited for this tournament and having the opportunity to host it here in Denmark! DEOs will be working during the tournament and assist as security at Memorial Park.

Please, obey **Village Code §105-16 which states no person shall consume any intoxicating liquor or fermented malt beverage upon the public highways, streets, alleys, sidewalks, street crossings, bridges, public parks or parking lots or premises held out to the public for use of their motor vehicles, whether the premises are publicly or privately owned.

Please, obey **Wis. Stats. §125.32(3) which states no premises for which a Class B license or permit may remain open between the hours of 2 a.m. and 6 a.m. On Saturday and Sunday, the closing hours shall be between 2:30 a.m. and 6 a.m. **Village Code §105-11(3)** mirrors the state statutes. There are limited exceptions in the state statute for the Sunday that daylight savings begins (3:30 a.m.) and New Year’s Day (no closing required). Extended hours beyond what the statute provide are not legally permissible and may not be granted.

Rockin’ the Hill – DEO Verheyen worked during the annual Lion’s Club concert in the park **June 15th**. Additional BCSO deputies were also present to assist with security at the park and in the Village.

MEETINGS AND ASSOCIATIONS

DEOs continue to introduce and build partnerships with local businesses, including those in the Denmark Community Business Association (DCBA). DEOs continue to attend **DCBA, Lion’s Club, Denmark Neighboring Association** (DNA), and any other special meetings such as McMahon engineering, when applicable.

DCBA – DEO Verheyen attended the meeting on **June 6th** at Denmark High School.

PUBLIC / CHRONIC NUISANCE

Currently, there is 1 property that is deemed a chronic nuisance in the Village of Denmark. This property is being subject to legal action and DEO Verheyen will be working with property owners to resolve the problems at this property.

HOUSE CHECK REQUESTS

DEOs continue to monitor House Check Requests. Stop in at the Village Hall to fill out a house check request form or find it on the village website, if you are leaving town for a period of time and would like to make us aware / check on your property.

DEOs monitored 1 house check request in June.

TRAFFIC ENFORCEMENT

There were 21 traffic stops initiated in the Village of Denmark in June.

-17 traffic citations issued; 19 traffic warnings issued

County deputies and BCSO Traffic Team continues to add extra patrol in the village to assist the DEOs with traffic complaints and construction zones / detours. Many added efforts and hours from them provided the Village with additional patrol and speed board enforcement.

School zone! The Village Crossing Guards worked fluidly and patiently during the last weeks of the school year and the construction zone on N. Wall St. Thank you to them for all their efforts and flexibility to work in these high volume traveled zones during school hours during this time of growth and change in the Village. DEO Verheyen also assisted by directing traffic and providing pedestrian safety at N. Wall St / North Av during the last week of the school year in June.

JOINT EFFORT IN DENMARK

Drug Task Force

Both DEOs continue to monitor the drug tips related to properties and/or citizens in the village.

School Resource Officer (SRO)

Both DEOs continue to work with SRO Dzekute at village schools and calls for service regarding the students of Denmark.

Traffic Team

BCSO Traffic Team assists the Village and DEO Verheyen in providing extra traffic enforcement in the Village.

Investigators

Currently, there is 1 open case with BCSO investigative division. Both DEOs continue to work with and communicate with the BCSO Investigators about current investigation.

Park hours – Remember, park hours for the general public are from 8:00 a.m. – 10:00 p.m. No person shall be present in the park after hours.

Thefts from vehicles – Please, remember to lock your vehicles! At all times of the day and no matter the duration you're leaving your vehicle.

Parking in Village – Please, remember Village Code **§289-5(D)** which states no person shall park any vehicle on any street, roadway, highway, or alley within the Village at any time for more than **48** continuous hours without movement.

CONSTRUCTION

With the CTH KB construction detour route, please be aware and follow:

1. **Kellner St** is a one-way roadway.
2. **Prospect St** has a posted speed limit of 25 mph.
3. **Hager Rd** (detour route) speed limit is 25 mph. Be aware of Boldt construction crews on the new Salm Partners site on Hager Rd.

These are residential roads and it takes a joint effort to keep everyone safe!

ROAD CLOSURES

County Highway KB road construction began on April 1 and is closed with a detour route. North Wall St construction began on April 8.

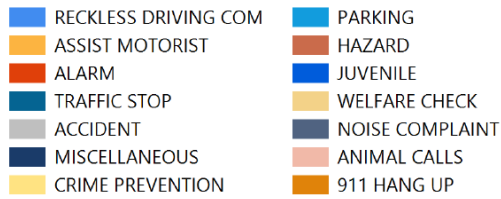

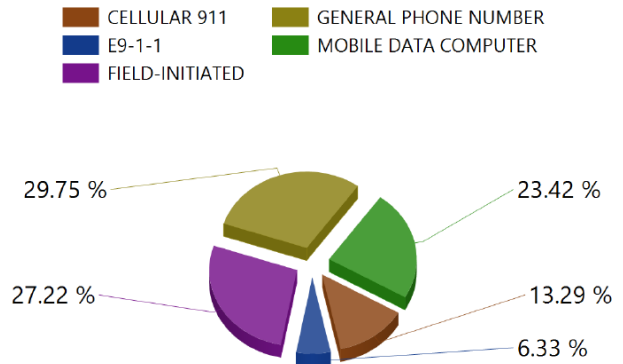

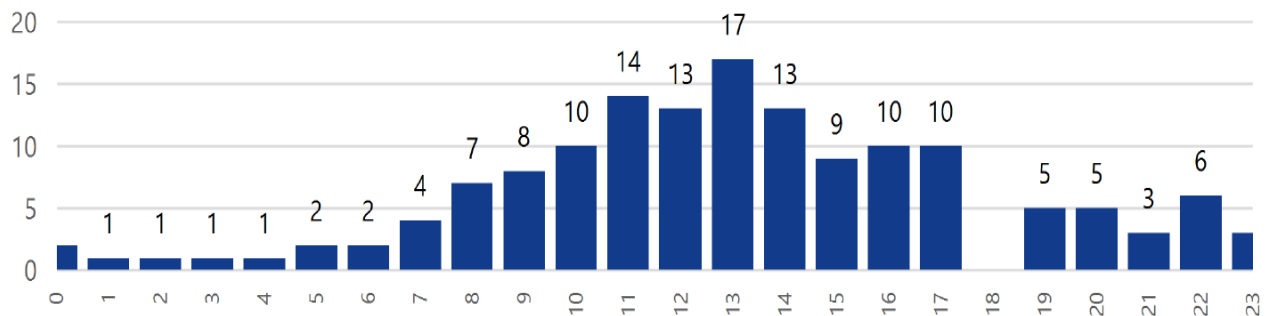
Top 10 Calls for Service By Type
